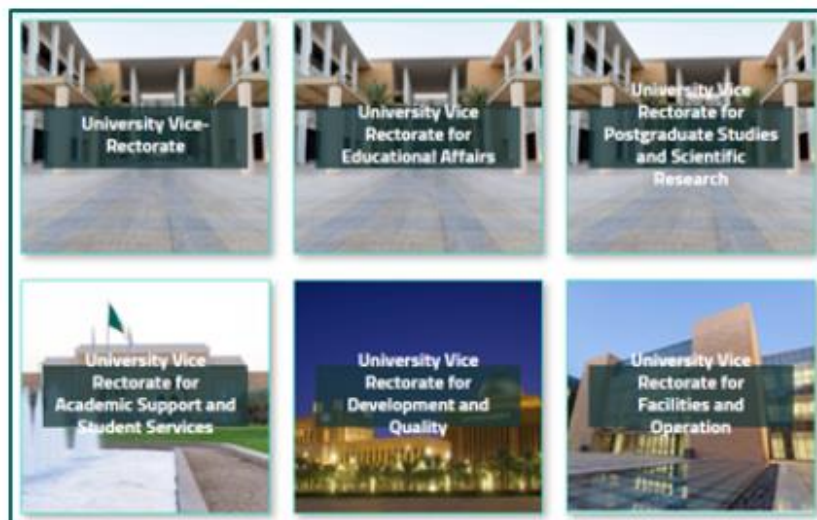


INVOLVEMENT IN GOVERNMENT SDG POLICY

Involvement in government SDG policy

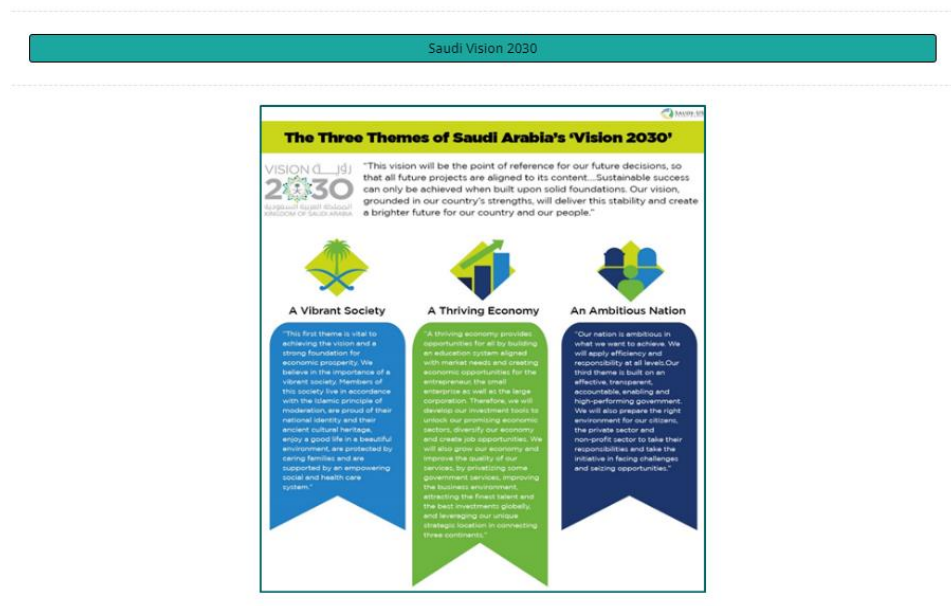

PNU's strategic goals are in alignment with Saudi's 2030 Vision. The seven key strategic goals of PNU are:

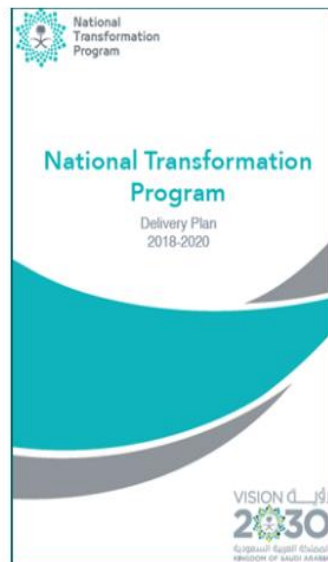
- The provision of quality academic programs.
