### Developing nursing education and research towards aligning Vision 2030

The Faculty of Nursing at Princess Noura Bint Abdulrahman University organized the second virtual nursing conference under the theme "Developing nursing education and research towards aligning Vision 2030" over two days with the aim of revealing the latest findings of science in nursing, the use of technology in training and education under the Corona pandemic, as well as research of modern evidence-based nursing practices with the participation of 16 speakers specializing in nursing and health services.

The conference opened with a speech by the Dean of the Faculty of Nursing, Dr. Samira Bint Ahmed Al-Sanani, in which she stressed the importance of evidence-based scientific research in the field of nursing, at the professional level and in the development of current and future health practices under the Corona pandemic, where scientific research in the field of nursing is an important element for the development of the educational process, and professional practices of the nursing profession, to ensure the safety of patients in the health system of the Kingdom, and in accordance with the trends of the Kingdom's vision 2030.

The first sessions of the conference began to learn about the strategic status of nursing education and its research in achieving the kingdom's vision 2030, the quality of the adoption of nursing programs and their future importance in improving the educational process of nursing colleges, in addition to medical law and professional practice ethics, especially in light of the Corona pandemic.

The second session addressed several topics, most notably e-education, the transition from education to professional practice, and health informatics nursing as an important and promising nursing specialty. The conference concluded its first day with the third session during which it was discussed the importance of standards and their effective role in the quality of research and the promotion of the cultural aspect.

The conference resumed its second day by discussing the impact of medical technologies and digital transformation on nursing practice, knowledge of effective nursing homes in how to deal with medical technology with the aim of improving medical care, in addition to recognizing the importance and benefits of specialized advanced nursing practice in the Kingdom and discussing its effective role in other countries economically and patient safety.

# Entering International ranking and working to be on the top:

#### Princess Noura University ranks first locally and regionally and ranked (27th) in the world in the 2021 THE University Impact Ranking

Princess Noura Bint Abdulrahman University, ranked first locally and regionally and ranked (27th) in the world, in the 2021 World Rankings (THE- University Impact Ranking) in its third edition, and ranked first in the world in the fifth goal of the Sustainable Development Goals "Gender Equality" as the largest women's university in the world focused on the qualification and empowerment of women to participate in development and decision-making.

Princess Noura Bint Abdulrahman University has its current ranking, based on the best results achieved by (4) goals: gender equality, decent work and economic growth, reducing inequality, partnerships to achieve the goals.

Work began in July 2020 on the preparation of the requirements for submitting this classification in four stages: studying all the sustainable development goals with the international classification team and the indicators required to measure each goal, setting targets based on the quality of evidence supporting each goal, forming the Standing Committee to achieve the requirements of global classifications by decision of his Excellency the Rector, in addition to reviewing the required evidence and reporting and submitting them to the body responsible for the classification.

Princess Noura Bint Abdulrahman University's progress in the third edition of the classification reflects its interest in sustainability by achieving a number of standards and indicators in various activities and practices in the fields of teaching, scientific research, community service, and measuring its impact based on the 17 UN sustainable development goals, which are a plan and framework towards achieving sustainable societies that address regional and global challenges.

The University Impact Rankin is a global ranking, launched by the British Times Foundation for assessing universities and measuring their impact on society based on their success in achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, with a total of 1,240 universities and educational institutions from 98 countries around the world accepting (1,115) universities from 94 countries.

It is noteworthy that the entry of Princess Noura Bint AbdulRahman University, in the list of the best international universities in this category, is in line with the university's orientation to achieve the goals of the Kingdom Vision 2030 by obtaining advanced ranks in the international rankings through the university's ongoing efforts to develop its various academic programs that keep pace with the requirements of development and the need of the labor market, and its research activities, in addition to its community role in sensing the issues of society.

### QS World Ranking 2022 Ranked 9th Place at Princess Noura University locally

Princess Noura Bint AbdulRahman University ranked ninth locally according to QS World Ranking 2022, while in the category of positions among (751-800) globally, out of 1,673 universities participating in the classification, where 1 300 universities, including 14 Saudi universities, and the university's result was included in the top 58% of the universities participating in the classification, and the university achieved 10% progress compared to the result achieved last year when it ranked 800-1000.

QS World University Rankings are an annual ranking issued by the British education institution QS Ququarelli Simmonds to evaluate universities from educational and research aspects and measure the university's impact on the local and global community based on a number of key indicators: academic reputation, university reputation among employers, ratio of faculty to number of students. The percentage of martyrdom per faculty member, the percentage of foreign faculty members, the proportion of foreign students.

It is worth mentioning that Princess Noura Bint Abdul Rahman University has applied for QS World Ranking 2022 to enhance the university's academic reputation locally and internationally and to achieve its mission of excellence and leadership to be on the lists of distinguished international universities. It also aims to improve the stereotype and empowerment of Saudi women by raising the university's place in international rankings.

### Princess Noura University receives WHO accreditation certificate for health-promoting university

### As the first Saudi and Arab university city

Princess Noura University receives WHO accreditation certificate for health-promoting university.

Princess Noura Bint Abdul Rahman University has received the WHO Accreditation Certificate as the first saudi and Arab university city to be promoted to health at the university level, a certificate awarded by WHO to health cities around the world.

Princess Noura Bint AbdulRahman University received its accreditation certificate on Sunday (June 27th) at the end of the "Jam health professions" event held at the university, organized by the Innovation Center of the Ministry of Health.

Through the "Noura Health" program, Princess Noura University has formed a supervisory committee for the University's Health Promoted Program headed by His Excellency the Rector, Dr. Inas Bint Suleiman al-Issa, which includes 10 committees representing the university community, one of its most important tasks: (supervising the university's accreditation steps from who as a health-promoting university, ensuring

the sustainability of unique community health programmes for national or international deployment, and raising the performance and mastery of community health programs by studying and evaluating them to reach tangible results on the health of students and employees).

In the past, the committees have begun to apply the 101 WHO standards under six main paths: (public paths, paths related to the university environment, pathways to promoting a healthy lifestyle, health improvement pathways, safety, emergency preparedness and response pathways, community participation and sustainability paths).

It is worth mentioning that the program "Sah Noura" charted his future vision to raise the performance of community programs and build a leading model at the level of Saudi universities, with his interest in the public health of the student and employee in its comprehensive concept, and prepared his message to move the university community and their partners towards changing policies and creating health initiatives and accomplishing community research to promote the health of society in line with the national transformation and vision of the Kingdom 2030.

This comes from princess Noura Bint Abdul Rahman University's interest in achieving a health care system that contributes to the pursuit of health for the community and its members, thus creating a leading model and a beacon for all countries of the world in the concept of promoting health.
