The Ministry of Municipal and Rural Affairs in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is responsible for the urban planning of the cities of the Kingdom, including the provision of roads and basic equipment, improvement and beautification of cities and the development of municipal and rural areas. be the home and workplace for more than a million citizens from around the world.



In the same way, Princess Nourah bint Abdulrahman University achieves 47 ranking advancement compared to its rank in the last year's "UI Green Metric 2019" rankings 28/04/1441 AH. <u>As the university ranked 138 out of 780 universities worldwide; and the second rank at the local level, while the six indicators are based on a specific classification methodology, i.e. Infrastructure (SI), Energy, Climate Change (ES), Waste (WS), Water (WR), Transport (TR), and Education (ED).</u>

On the other hand, the university worked according to an innovative approach to the strategy of establishing and organizing volunteer work in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Through the establishment of (Nourah Al-Ataa Volunteer Incubator) which is a specialized incubator for volunteering and qualifying volunteers, according to the sustainable development methodology that was officially opened by H.E. the Rector of the University at the King Salman Forum for Youth.

The Nourah Al-Ataa Volunteer Incubator represents a future creative vision for sustainable volunteering in the country, so that this project is an experience house for spreading the culture of volunteerism, enhancing its role in the comprehensive development of society in partnership with leading voluntary bodies and societies. As well as organizing the utilization of energies and human resources inside and outside the university through preparing and qualifying them for national volunteering. The incubator developed the capabilities of volunteers, honed their skills in volunteering, granted them a national volunteer license, and qualified them according to the first and second volunteer license program.



These efforts come within the responsibility of Princess Nourah University in serving the society and achieving its strategy in the field of social responsibility and volunteering, to be an active partner in building and developing the community. As it has been keen to activate volunteer work inside and outside the university for the vision of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, as it seeks through the incubator to contribute in raising the number Volunteers in Saudi Arabia to one million volunteers by 2030, such that may to serve as guidelines to stablished future sustainable communities.






Central Library




Who deserves accommodation?

- Scholarship students according to the scholarship rules.
- Saudi students residing at remote areas more than 150 km away from Riyadh City.
- Students of special status whose status requires to be examined by the Deanship of Students Affairs.
- Non-Saudi student who meets the rental conditions specified by the Deanship of Student Affairs.

Services:

- Securing and equipping the accommodation buildings to receive the students in coordination with the concerned department.
- Providing the highest level of health, social and psychological care to students residing within the dormitory.
- Providing integrated meals for students at discounted prices.
- Providing means of transportation to serve the dormitory students.
- Providing computer and telephone networks to facilitate external communication.
- Providing multiple commercial services (student serviceprovisions- restaurant- cafe) as needed by students.

- Conducting extracurricular activities at the students' accommodation.
