English Language 102 is an intermediate course intended to provide students with a foundation from which they can advance from A2 waystage to B1 threshold on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). B1 learner can understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters, produce simple connected text on topics which are familiar or of personal interest, describe experiences and events and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans. It is a fifteen-week module course with 12 hours of instruction each week.

Eng101 is a pre-requisite of Eng102. However, if the students meet the exemption or credit requirements or they scored +40 in the placement test, they can be directly enrolled to 102.
