

Frequently Asked Questions

Academic Excellence Admission Track

Q1: What is the Academic Excellence Admission Track?

A: It is a track designed for academically distinguished female high school graduates who meet the specified requirements. It enables them to be directly placed (assigned) into their programs after successfully completing the foundation year, without entering the standard program allocation competition. This applies to programs in colleges that require a foundation year, according to the approved seat capacity. Admission to this track is conditional upon the student achieving a cumulative GPA of no less than 4.5 out of 5 after completing the foundation year requirements. If the required GPA is not achieved, the student will be allocated to one of the programs associated with the foundation year to which she was originally admitted, according to the announced allocation mechanism.

Q2: Who is eligible to apply for this track?

A: Only high school graduates from the same year of application who have obtained a composite score of no less than 95%.

Q4: What are the application requirements for this track?

A: The following conditions must be met:

- Fulfillment of the University's general admission requirements.
- No more than one year has passed since obtaining the high school certificate.
- A composite score of no less than 95%.

Q5: Does applying to this track affect the application to the Foundation Year track?

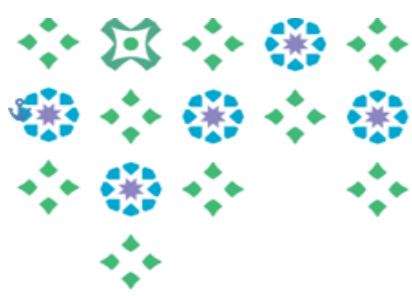
A: No. Applying to the Academic Excellence Admission Track does not cancel or affect the application to the Foundation Year for Health Colleges or the College of Engineering. Each track is considered independently according to its own requirements and criteria.

Q6: Does admission to this track exempt the student from studying the Foundation Year?

A: No. The student must complete the Foundation Year and achieve a cumulative GPA of no less than (4.5 out of 5).

Q7: What happens if a student does not achieve a GPA of (4.5 out of 5) after the Foundation Year?

A: If the required GPA is not achieved, the student will be allocated to one of the programs within



the Foundation Year track to which she was originally admitted, according to the announced allocation mechanism.

Q8: How are applicants selected?

A: Selection and sorting are conducted automatically and competitively among all eligible applicants, based on the approved seat capacity.
